

MLA Style – Citing Print Resources

Guidelines

1. Do not number items.
2. Alphabetize the list by the authors' last names. If the author's name is not given, alphabetize by the title.
3. Start on the left margin. After the first line, indent the second line.
4. When you start a new entry, go back to the left margin for the first line.
5. Double space. Examples are single spaced to save paper.

Book

Author. Title. City of publication: Publisher, year. Page numbers.

Single Author

Sherron, Victoria. Endangered Mammals of North America. New York: Chronicle Books, 1994. 65.

Two or More Authors

Smith, John and Susan Lane. Space Travel in the 21st Century. New York: Random House, 2002. 103.

Reference Book

"Title of Article." Name of Encyclopedia. Edition or volume. Year.

Unsigned Article

"Columbus Discovers America." World Book Encyclopedia. 10th ed. 1993.

Signed Article

Vorhaus, Louis. "Warts." Collier's Encyclopedia. 1993 ed.

Pamphlet

Title of pamphlet. City of Publication: Publisher, Year.

Gun Control. New York: American Rifle Association, 2002.

Magazine Article

Author. "Title of Article." Name of Magazine. Day Month Year: Pages.

Tully, Shawn. "The Universal Teenager." Fortune. 4 Apr. 1994: 14-16.

Newspaper Article

Author. "Title of Article." Name of Newspaper. Day Month Year, Edition: Pages.

Green Bob. "Heartland AIDS Ride." Chicago Tribune. 27 July 2002, Final Ed., Tempo sec.: 14+.

Sound Recording

Artist. Name of Recording. Manufacturer, Year of issue.

Collins, Phil. No Jacket Required. Atlantic Recording Corp., 1985.

Video Recording

Title. Director. Distributor, Year of release.

In the Line of Fire. Dir. Wolfgang Petersen. Columbia Pictures, 2000.

Personal Interview

Last Name, First Name. Personal Interview. Day Month Year.

Smith, John. Personal Interview. 15 Sept. 2001.

Lecture, Speech, Address or Reading

Speaker's Name. "Title of Presentation (if known)." The meeting and the sponsoring organization (if applicable). The location. Date. *If no title use appropriate descriptive label, Address, Lecture, Keynote Speech, Reading with no quotation marks.*

MLA STYLE – Citing Electronic Resources

Guidelines

In general, Electronic Sources should include the following information:

1. Author's name
2. Title of the document
3. Title of the scholarly project, databases, periodical, or professional or personal site
4. Name of the editor of the scholarly project or database
5. Date of electronic publication or last update
6. Name of the institution or organization sponsoring or associated with the site
7. Date when you accessed the source
8. Internet Address, or URL
9. Double space. Examples are single spaced to save paper.
